NEW THINGS YOU WILL SEE THIS LENT IN THE SANCTUARY

You probably have noticed changes in the liturgy this Lent. One of the main things being the music and how it has become subdued with less organ accompaniment as the Church instructs us. Another small change is the dressing of the chalice with the burse and veil. A burse, which comes from the Latin word for purse, is traditionally two pieces of cardboard covered with cloth in which the corporal (the piece of linen on which the consecration happens) is placed. Both the burse and veil cover the chalice all of Mass until the offertory. Far from being practical (or not practical at all), veiling the chalice has theological significance. The Church advocates that we do this. In *The General Instruction for the Roman Missal*, it states, "It is a praiseworthy practice for the chalice to be covered with a veil, which may be either of the color of the day or white" (GIRM 118). Like other aspects of the liturgy, a veil adds mystery to what is happening, thus adding dignity and reverence to the Mass. Not only that, however, the veil harkens back to the Old Testament and Jewish worship.

The book of Hebrews tells us that, "the first covenant had regulations for worship and an earthly sanctuary. For a tent was prepared, the outer one, in which were the lampstand and the table and the bread of the Presence; it is called the Holy Place. Behind the second curtain stood a tent called the Holy of Holies, having the golden altar of incense and the ark of the covenant covered on all sides with gold, which contained a golden urn holding the manna, and Aaron's rod that budded, and the tables of the covenant" (Hebrews 9: 2-4). The Jews used a curtain to veil the holiest place on earth for them, the place where God's presence dwelt. Hence, we use a veil to cover the chalice to remind us that we are approaching the Holy of Holies, the real and substantial presence of God himself in the Eucharist. However, things are different for us than they were for the Jewish people. Only the high priest could enter the Holy of Holies once a year, while for us Catholics the veil is pulled off at every Mass. But why do we have access to the Holy of Holies now? Scripture answers this question for us. When Jesus died on the cross, the Gospel of Matthew says that the "curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom" (Matt: 27: 51). Christ's death has torn down the barrier and given us complete access to God. Now at the offertory at Mass, we Christians can enter the Holy of Holies because Christ has taken off the veil.

Blessed and holy Lent to you all!

TRUSTEE ELECTIONS

In accordance with Wisconsin State Law, each parish has two lay trustees — the Trustee Secretary and Trustee Treasurer. They serve as the legal Board for the parish along with the Pastor, the Archbishop and the Vicar General of the Archdiocese. Each lay trustee serves a two year term, which is renewable. Our current trustees are Mr. James Carrig (Secretary) and Mr. Gordon Giampietro (Treasurer). Fr. Schumaker had nominated both Mr. Giampietro and Mr. Carrig for a renewal of term. The parish charter also allows any practicing, baptized and confirmed Catholic member of the parish, at least 25 years old, to place his/her name in nomination in writing along with nominations by at least 10 adult practicing parish members, which were due on Monday, February 26. Since no additional nominations were received, Mr. Gordon Giampietro has been elected to serve as Trustee-Treasurer and Mr. James Carrig as Trustee-Secretary.

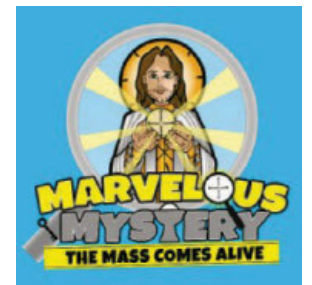

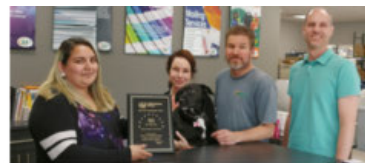
