† March 8th, Labyrinth Prayer Walk

Grades first through eighth will walk the labyrinth prayer in the school gym on Friday, March 8th, from 9:00AM until 2:15PM. Walking a prayer labyrinth involves three stages: purgation (releasing of bad thoughts, concerns, worries, etc.), illumination (receiving guidance, direction, & inspiration from Christ), and union (returning to Christ in holiness). *We hope parents and parishioners will also come to walk the Labyrinth with us.*

† Reconciliation Service for Second through Eighth Grade Students



We celebrate this sacrament during the Lenten season to heal, reconcile, and live in a right relationship with God and with others. Students will receive the sacrament in church on a date to be announced in early Lent.

† April 18th, Holy Thursday, 9:45AM, Grade 8 Living Stations of the Cross

† Family & Student Lenten Resources

This year we are sending home resources for families with students in grades K5 – 5 to use at home, while also having our Jr. High students use a special Lenten Scripture Journal in Theology class time.

† Classroom Lenten Posters

Each homeroom class will have a special poster with the school's Lenten theme - *Follow the Cross to Jesus* - and logo displayed upon it. Students and teachers will sign the poster to remind them to live out this theme through each day of Lent. Our Lenten Posters will then be used each Wednesday morning of Lent as a special reminder for students to enter the school in silent union with Jesus.

† Silent Entry Wednesdays

Students will enter the school silently while reflective music plays in the hallways, reflecting how they are to do small acts of kindness to “piece” together their faith in Jesus, especially during this Lenten season.

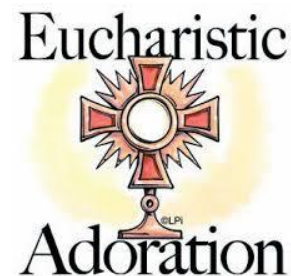


† Weekly Wednesday Classroom Prayer Services

Every Wednesday morning starting March 13th, (not on Ash Wednesday due to morning liturgy), each homeroom will do a Lenten prayer service at 7:45am in their classroom. At the end of these prayer services, students will reflect on how they are following Jesus this Lent.

† Personal Lenten Adoration

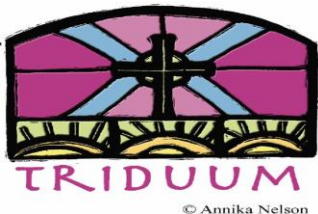
Once again, this year all students will spend time praying in the Adoration Chapel to help them build a stronger prayer life with Jesus. This silent, holy prayer time before the Blessed Sacrament will be done at various times throughout this Lenten season.



† Grades 6-8 Wednesday Retreat Time

In each Wednesday's theology class time, students will reflect on their three Lenten promises on their Giving Chart in a retreat time in the church and Adoration Chapel. The three Lenten promises they will focus on are: 1) giving up something for Jesus; 2) spending more time in personal prayer; 3) serving others in a new and special way.

† April 18th - 21st, Easter Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter
