Baptism Preparation

Children ages 6 and under: Those seeking to have children baptized should be registered, active members of St. Mary's. Parents who request baptism for a child are expected to complete a preparation class. Baptism preparation classes are offered bi-monthly. It is generally easier if the preparation is done before the birth of the child. If you have attended a session within the last five years, it is not necessary to retake the class. Funeral Masses

The death of a loved one represents a deep loss and, at times, a tragic event. The Church recognizes the need both to remember the soul of the deceased and to assist in healing the human anguish of those who remain behind. At the time of death, the family, directly or through the funeral director, will contact the Parish Office to schedule the day and time of the funeral or Memorial Mass. Once the time has been set, the family will meet with the priest, at which time they will be given a planner and all the necessary materials to help them plan the funeral liturgy. Marriage Preparation

The Catholic Church takes preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously. Generally at least 6 months should be allowed for this preparation. Engaged couples themselves should call the parish office to schedule an appointment to discuss their plans. Marriage can take place any day of the week, although Saturday is generally preferred by couples. Sunday weddings are possible, but a wedding Mass is not allowed for such occasions. OPPORTUNITIES FOR GIVING TIME

Some may not seem specialized and yet they are so basic that without them, our families would suffer greatly: cooking, cleaning and managing a home and family. PARISH COMMITTEES

Pastoral Council: The Pastoral Council serves as an advisory body to the pastor and parish staff. Representing the broad diversity of parishioners, their wisdom helps guide the spiritual leadership, governance and planning of the parish. Standing committees include: Advancement & Communications, Building & Grounds, Catholic Formation, Finance Council, Prayer & Worship, School Advisory and Home & School. Ad hoc committees are appointed as needed for special projects and activities. There are 7 members, each serving a two year term. The selection of new members of the Council is by discernment. Advancement & Communications: The Advancement & Communications Committee serves to promote the parish through traditional and social media and develops opportunities for parish members to contribute and commit their time, talent and treasure to the mission of the parish. Building & Grounds: The Building & Grounds Committee members provide oversight and guidance for maintaining, utilizing and advancing parish and school buildings and real estate. The committee consists of 12-15 individuals with varied experience in contractor trades, building services and landscape service fields. Catholic Formation: The purpose of the Catholic Formation Committee is to give leadership to the parish, Parish Pastoral Council and Catholic Formation staff in the areas of Catholic Formation/Religious Education for children, youth, young adults, adults, families and many specialized groups. Their concerns include religious instruction, sacramental preparation, evangelization, family life, vocation, spirituality and ecumenical and interfaith activities. The Catholic Formation Committee will determine how often to meet with the expectation of an initial one year term. **Contact:** Josh Dieterich or Elizabeth Harrison in the Catholic Formation Office, 262-782-4575

Finance Council: The Finance Council provides advice and guidance to the Pastor in the administration of parish assets. The Council is advisory to the pastor. Standing sub committees assist in development of the annual budget, regular and annual financial reports to the parish community and stewardship. The sub committees report back to the Council. There are six members on the Council. New members are confirmed by the pastor. Prayer & Worship Committee: The Prayer and Worship Committee works closely with the Liturgy & Music Office to evaluate all aspects of liturgy at St. Mary's and develops ways to improve the worship, prayer and spiritual life of our parish community. The study of liturgical documents and texts throughout the year forms committee members for this task. Meetings are held six times a year, September-May. Terms run two years with no more than two consecutive terms. **Contact:** Liturgy and Music Office, 262-782-4485

School Committee: The School Committee serves as an advisory body to the Principal. It coordinates the work of subcommittees, approves the budget and monitors the school plan. Subcommittees: Advancement handles school recruiting, publicity and marketing. Planning monitors student programs, seeks input and develops responses to needs. Policy reviews handbook, seeks input, develops proposals for policy additions or changes. Budget prepares and monitors annual budget for the school. Technology maintains technology plan, envisions growth and implements plans. Ad Hoc Projects assist in studying and planning for needs that arise throughout the school year. School Committee and Planning Committee meet once per month. Technology meets quarterly. Policy, Budget and Advancement meet as needed. **Contact:** School Office, 262-782-7057

Home & School Committee: The H & S Committee provides programs, opportunities and funds to assist our school children and families with educational, religious and community enhancement. Volunteer needs are as follows: Board Members; Chair or Co-Chair, Secretary, Treasurer and Volunteer Coordinator. Time Commitment: One school year with monthly board meetings. Committee/Program Chairs for the following programs: Publicity, New Parent Social, Dance-a-thon, Magazine Drive, Parish Picnic (6th Grade Families) Trivia Night, Spooks & Spoofs, Scholastic Book Fair, Chili Chomp, Memorial Day Parade Float, Elementary Forensics, Jr. High Forensics, Field Day, Hospitality, SCRIP Auction. Program Chairs organize volunteers within their committee. **Contact:** School Office, 262-782-7057

LITURGY & MUSIC

Adoration Chapel: Volunteers are needed to spend time as Adorers of the Holy Eucharist in the Chapel. Coverage is needed 24/7. You may commit for an hour weekly, bi-weekly or monthly, depending on your schedule. Substitutes are also needed. If you cannot sign up for a regular hour, you may volunteer to serve as a substitute, to be contacted when a need arises. Volunteers are needed to maintain the environment within the chapel. **Contact:** Parish Office, 262-782-4575

Annual Adoration Chapel Cleaners are needed for 2-hour shifts on Good Friday and Holy Saturday. Volunteers must be physically able to do deep cleaning and be comfortable climbing a ladder. **Contact:** Fran Auger, 262-782-5861

Altar Society/Holy Dusters: Volunteers are needed to perform general housecleaning duties of altars and sacristies, once a month on Fridays for an hour or two. **Contact:** Nancy Raml, through Jenny Dascoli, 262-782-4485 or jdascoli@stmaryeg.org

Art & Environment Ministry: This ministry consists of volunteers who decorate the sanctuary and church throughout the liturgical year. Their function is to develop an atmosphere within the worship area that enhances the prayer life of the community and promotes their active participation. Christmas and Easter are the major seasons that require assistance. All are welcome to volunteer, whether you're creative or simply able to offer a helping hand. Assistance is also needed for selling poinsettias during Advent and Easter lilies during Lent. Choirs: Listed below are the opportunities to serve the Church through sacred music for the 2018-2019 choir years. Detailed rehearsal and liturgy schedules available. All rehearsals are in the choir loft.

Cantors: Cantors must be a member of one of the choirs and are required to attend one cantor rehearsal the week prior to singing for Mass.

Celestial Singers: Open to all boys and girls in 3rd - 5th grade. No audition required. Rehearse Mondays, 5:15-6:15 pm.

Knights of the Choir Loft: Open to all boys in 6th - 8th grade. No audition required, but members must be able to match pitches. Rehearse Mondays, 3:15-4:15 pm.

Mary's Angels Children's Choir: Open to all boys and girls in 1st and 2nd grade. No audition required. Rehearse Mondays, 4:15-5:15 pm.

Men's Schola: Open to all men age 16 and up. Rehearse Wednesdays at 6:30 pm. Audition required. Sing for one Mass each month (schedule adjusted for Feast Days and Holy Week).

Musica Oramus: Open to experienced choir members/vocalists age 12 through young adult. Audition required. Rehearse Mondays, 6:30-8:00 pm.

Visitation Choir: Open to all adults. Must be able to match pitches and have access to email for rehearsal recordings. Rehearse Mondays, 7:00-8:00 pm.

Church Linen Maintenance: Volunteers are responsible for the cleaning of the sacristy linens and server albs. Linens can be washed at the volunteer's home. Help is needed several hours during the weeks in which volunteer is scheduled. Volunteers are scheduled on a rotating basis. **Contact:** Jenny Dascoli, 262-782-4485 or jdascoli@stmaryeg.org

Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist: Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist are privileged to assist the presider in distributing the Body and Blood of Christ to the assembly. They serve at all liturgies. There is a group who minister only at the daily 6:30 am Mass. All Catholics who have been confirmed are invited to share in this special ministry. Scheduled approximately twice a month. Mass preferences are accommodated. **Contact:** Jenny Dascoli, 262-782-4485 or jdascoli@stmaryeg.org

Lectors: Lectors accept the privileged role of proclaiming the Word of God in a manner that can nourish the assembly. They reflect upon the reading itself as well as its contextual background. They apply effective methods of oral proclamation so that the congregation may enter into the experience of God's Living Word. High school youth and adult parishioners interested in proclaiming God's Word are always welcome. Scheduled once or twice a month. Mass preferences accommodated. **Contact:** Jenny Dascoli, 262-782-4485 or jdascoli@stmaryeg.org

Marriage Preparation: Happily married couples are needed to help prepare engaged couples for the Sacrament of Matrimony and administer the FOCCUS questionnaire. Training is provided. Sponsor couples work with 1-2 couples per year and meet with each couple 2-3 times. **Contact:** Deacon Chuck Kustner, 414-466-8967

Ministers of Hospitality: Ministers of Hospitality are the first to welcome each person to Sunday worship. They help with the collection, the Communion procession and other needs of the community. The Ministry of Hospitality is open to all ages. Young children are encouraged to participate as able with their families. Scheduled one month at a time at the Mass of your choice. **Contact:** Jenny Dascoli, 262-782-4485 or jdascoli@stmaryeg.org

Sacristans: Sacristans open the church doors in the morning and set up Mass needs for the priests. Replenishing candles as needed is also part of the position. Volunteers are needed before and after 6:30 am Mass, rotating every 4-6 weeks. **Contact:** Jenny Dascoli, 262-782-4485 or jdascoli@stmaryeg.org

Servers/Adult: Volunteers are trained to be Acolyte ministers who serve at the daily 6:30 am and Saturday 8:00 am Masses. Adult servers are scheduled for a week at a time every six to eight weeks. **Contact:** Jenny Dascoli, 262-782-4485 or jdascoli@stmaryeg.org

Servers/Youth: Boys and girls who are in 6th grade through high school are invited to be altar servers. They act as the assembly's representatives in assisting the presider in the celebration of daily and Sunday Mass, weddings and other liturgical celebrations. Servers are trained both to assist in the celebrations and to prepare and clean up the sanctuary and sacristy. Servers are scheduled for your preferred weekend Mass, approximately 1-2 times every 3 months. Day students are scheduled for the 8:00 am Mass during the school year.

Servers/Funerals: Adult and high school servers assist our priests at funerals as needed. High school students serve on weekends and during school vacations. **Contact:** Jenny Dascoli, 262-782-4485 or jdascoli@stmaryeg.org

SCHOOL

School parents donate hundreds of hours of service, selecting their roles in August. We welcome non-school parent parishioner assistance for many of our activities. We extend our thanks to all school parent and non-school parent volunteers. Please contact the School Office, 262-782-7057 unless otherwise specified. Volunteer opportunities are as follows:

Ambassador Family: Assist in the recruitment of new families by providing tours during Open House and to follow up with prospective families to invite them to various programs, to make them feel welcomed and to respond to any questions they might have.

Athletics: There are various athletic opportunities available. Contact the Athletic Director through the School Office.

Auction for Education: This is an annual adult social function and fundraiser held in the school gymnasium. Volunteers are needed to assist with the silent auction. This involves help with solicitation, follow-up, packaging and set-up of donated items. Volunteers are also needed with decorations, set up and clean up.

Book Fair: Volunteers are needed to assist students and parents with selection and sales throughout the week of the Book Fair.

Field Day: This year-end event is held at SMV or the Elm Grove Village Park. Volunteers are needed to help run the various competitions and serve lunch. This event runs all day.

Forensics: A highly successful program for students in 3rd–8th grade. Volunteers are needed to assist at both in-house and outside meets in the areas of coaching, hospitality, and awards. Training will be provided for coaching.

Hospitality: All events are preplanned and you are given a list of all the events for the year (usually 8 to 10). Great for people who like to cook and those that do not have time to cook. You will receive an email two weeks prior to an event and will be given a choice of items to prepare or purchase. Meals are usually simple: salads, desserts, soups, fruits, veggies, etc. Even though we love homemade things, we do also ask for items that can easily be bought such as rolls, condiments, lunch meats, drinks, etc. We especially need helpers for setup and cleanup, so if you can just donate some time here or there (you can even bring your kids) that would be great! Eat, drink, and be merry!

Library Aides: Assist students during scheduled library time and/or categorize and shelve books as directed by the Librarian. Times are flexible. In-service required.

Memorial Day Parade: The fourth grade classes are responsible for coordinating the SMV activities for the Elm Grove Memorial Day Parade. You will be representing the school during the parade.

Parish Pancake Breakfast: The Pancake Breakfast is sponsored by the Boy Scouts and takes place in January. Volunteers are needed for a variety of tasks including ticket sales, ordering food, food service, decorations, dishwashing, set up, clean up and day of event help. **Contact:** School Office, 262-782-7057

Parish Picnic Volunteer: In September, sixth grade school parents organize and host a picnic for parishioners to thank them for their support of the school. Following the 11:00 am Sunday Mass parishioners share a meal, visit and enjoy entertainment. Volunteers are needed to assist in scheduling volunteers, organize children's games or activities, entertainment, marketing, decorations, set up, take down and help day of the event.

Room Parent: The teacher's main contact for organizing Classroom Aides to assist with special projects, field trips and other classroom needs. Commitment will vary depending upon grade level and classroom.
